



Wax-Resist Watercolors

This is a classic art project using crayons and watercolor paints.

Supplies:

- Watercolor paper or sturdy paper
- Watercolor paints
- Water
- Paintbrush
- Crayons

Instructions

1. Always write your name on your art!
2. Draw your design on your paper-
White crayon can look really cool after you paint but can be really hard to see when coloring, I usually use a light color like yellow or light blue so I can see what I am coloring!
3. Paint over your design with watercolors, be sure to use enough water so that your paints can flow off of the wax left behind by your crayon.
4. Wait for you art to dry then hang it in a place of honor (like the fridge)
